



Award Winning Author and Aquarist to Speak on Ocean Conservation at May Meeting



Please join us on Saturday, May 18th at 9:30 am at First Presbyterian Church in Oceanside for an enjoyable presentation by Pamela Jackson. She is a professional Aquarist, Ocean Expert and a Mom's Choice Gold award winning author. She is co-founder of the global education and oceans conservation organization, EverythingOceans, whose mission is to create awareness and empowerment for the next generation of ocean stewards.

She is a wonderful example of what our STEM's Tech Trek students can become and AAUW's mission to promote lifelong education and positive societal changes. She graduated with honors from the specialized Aquarium & Aquaculture Science program at Saddleback College in California, which required her to be efficient in the STEM components in order to run a large public facility like The Aquarium of the Pacific.

Pamela considers the oceans to be the world's largest aquarium that desperately needs to be cared for as a critical part of the earth's ecosystem. Her love of the ocean led her to write a children's book "Ocean Adventures With Jax".

The importance of ocean conservation is vividly demonstrated in her PowerPoint presentation. It is timely, relevant and will leave us inspired. Pamela is the daughter of one of our own COV members, Sharlene Bergart.

2019-20 DUES ARE DUE!

It's dues renewal time everyone. Please use the attached form and note the deadline of June 30, 2019. Please enter your name (printed, please) – all remaining information on the top half of the form needs only be included if there have been changes to any of the information in the past year.

Please note: AAUW National has made some changes in its dues renewal procedures effective this year. They will no longer be accepting individual member or branch checks. They have created a system for on-line payments *only*, whether from members or branch finance officers. While this system does give members the option of paying by credit card, it is the opinion of your Finance team that the system is complicated and cumbersome. If you choose this option, you may NOT go to the National website to pay; rather, you need to contact Sue Mitchell, who then sends you an e-mail with an imbedded link that you then use to pay.

In addition, if you choose this option you must send the *full* amount – including your branch dues – to National, and then we must wait for National to reimburse us. The Board does have some concerns about timely reimbursements. For these reasons, the Board is encouraging members to continue to pay by check to COV; the Finance team will then pay National and State with the branch credit card.

Annual Meeting Delivers!

Throughout the year, members of your AAUW-CA Board have been contacting branch presidents all up and down the state, to find out what branches are struggling with and how AAUW-CA can help. At the Annual State Membership meeting held in San Diego on April 6th, Board members were "all ears" as they demonstrated the meeting's theme of "We Called...You Answered...We Listened." The overwhelming needs branches expressed were with growing and retaining membership and developing new leaders. The morning Membership and afternoon Leadership panels offered lots of ideas for meeting these needs. The "Leadership Development Kit," with its "Leadership Talent Pipeline" and "Mentoring" models were especially helpful. Members also enjoyed hearing about innovative programs that other branches were engaged in, as six branches received Certificates of Recognition for mission-based programs that their branches had been involved in for a year or more. Of special note was Healdberg's participation in the international program "Days for Girls," in which branch members assemble feminine hygiene kits to be delivered to girls from impoverished nations. And of course, the hit of the day was the Speech Trek contest in which the top 3 finalists competed for the 1st place prize of \$1,500. This year's topic, "How Do We Prevent Violence Aimed at Our Schools" evoked intense emotions from both the speakers and the audience, but these talented young women kept it together and delivered excellent speeches.
